DESCRIPTION

Objectives

- 1. To raise awareness among students about the importance of financial literacy for personal and professional growth.
- 2. To provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the securities market and the importance of smart investing.
- 3. To enable participants to make informed and strategic financial decisions through practical insights and tools.
- 4. To engage students in interactive activities to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world financial scenarios.
- 5. To introduce students to different types of investment avenues such as stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and real estate.
- 6. To equip students with the ability to evaluate and manage risks in their investment choices, ensuring a balanced approach to wealth-building.
- 7. To encourage students to critically assess financial information, enabling them to make sound investment decisions in dynamic markets.
- 8. To familiarize students with modern digital tools like demat accounts and online trading platforms to enhance their investment efficiency.
- 9. To provide an understanding of the regulatory framework surrounding the securities market, including investor protection and grievance mechanisms.

Key Takeaways

1. Securities Market Overview:-

The workshop introduced students to the two main types of markets the **primary market**, where new securities are issued and sold to the public for the first time (e.g., during Initial Public Offerings, or IPOs) and the **secondary market**, where previously issued securities are bought and sold among investors. Understanding the functions of these markets is crucial for making well-informed investment decisions.

2. Investment Basics:-

Key concepts like savings, inflation, and taxation were discussed to show their impact on investment returns. **Savings** highlight the importance of setting aside money for future needs, while **inflation** erodes the value of those savings over time. **Taxation** affects the final returns on investments, as taxes can reduce overall profits. The session also emphasized **goal-based investing**, where individuals align their investments with financial goals like retirement or buying a home, ensuring that their investments serve specific objectives.

3. Digital Financial Tools:-

The role of **demat accounts** was discussed as a vital tool in modern investment management. Demat accounts allow investors to store, manage, and trade securities electronically, simplifying the investment process and reducing paperwork. This tool provides greater security and ease of access for managing one's investment portfolio.

4. Risk and Reward Relationship:-

The workshop highlighted the direct link between risk and potential returns. Higher returns typically come with higher risks, and investors must assess their **risk tolerance** before making decisions. **Risk management strategies** such as diversification—spreading investments across different types of assets (e.g., stocks, bonds, real estate)—were introduced as methods to reduce exposure to any single risk, thus creating a balanced portfolio.

5. Importance of Early Investing:-

Starting to invest early was a key focus of the session. Mr. Bhaskar explained how **compound interest** allows investments to grow exponentially over time, as returns start earning their own returns. The earlier one begins investing, the more time they allow their money to grow, which can lead to significant financial gains in the long term.

6. Nomination and Will Creation:-

The need for proper financial planning, including the creation of **nominations** and **wills**, was emphasized. **Nominations** ensure that specific financial assets (like bank accounts, insurance policies) are passed on to designated beneficiaries in the event of the investor's death. A **will** ensures that all

assets, including property and investments, are distributed according to the individual's wishes, helping to avoid legal disputes and confusion for the family.

7. Grievance Redressal Mechanism:-

Participants were informed about the **grievance redressal systems** available in the securities market, such as SEBI (Securities and Exchange Board of India). These systems help investors resolve any disputes or issues related to their investments. The session provided guidance on how to lodge complaints and seek resolutions, ensuring that investors are aware of their rights and the mechanisms in place to protect them.

Learning Outcomes

1. Students gained a practical understanding of the securities market, enabling them to differentiate between primary and secondary markets.

2. They learned how to create and manage a digital portfolio using a demat account.

3. Students learned how to assess investment opportunities based on risk, rewards, taxation, and inflation, improving their decision-making process.

4. Students understood the advantages of starting investments early to maximize financial returns. They learned that early investing leverages compound interest, allowing their money to grow significantly over time.

5. They acquired knowledge about the importance of creating nominations and wills to secure their investments.

6. The workshop provided students with the skills to tackle and resolve investment-related issues.

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




How would you rate your overall experience of the session?


How would you rate the guest speaker's presentation skills?
